ministries in which we strive to serve are all such wonderful aspects of His amazing grace in our lives. We thank Him for His countless blessings and praise His Holy Name!

This year's conference will again convene at Camp Hillview, July 18-21. Our theme is *I Will Not Be Silent, I Will Praise!* We note the language of the theme texts uses the word "will" more than once. It involves both what we who love the Lord will not do and what we will do.

On Wednesday, we explore "The Imperative of Worship." Worship stems from a strong desire. The psalmist speaks of a determination of the strongest resolve. It is as if it is impossible to stay silent. The abundant mercies of God demand our whole heart.

Thursday's message addresses "Christ's Two Songs." Both of our theme verses come from chapters that include foreshadowing of the life and death of Jesus Christ. There is only one instance in the scriptures mentioning a singing Christ. "And when they had sung an hymn, they went out into the mount of Olives." (Matthew 26:30). The Messianic prophecy of Psalms 69 seems to suggest a second song. It was a song of victory celebrating the Resurrection.

The focus of Friday's service is "We Sing Intensely, We Sing In Tenses." The truths presented in the texts of our first two services are joined to make a practical application to the times that we will say, I Will Sing! We sing remembering the past, we sing in the reality of our present hour, and we will sing in the future.

We are very happy to announce that our guest minister for the week will be Elder Pat McCoy of the Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church. Brother Pat, however, is no guest at Workshop! He has been a foundational pillar of leadership throughout our history. As a spiritual leader, mentor, music participant and faithful supporter, he has truly had the heart of a servant in our efforts. We ask that you pray for him as he prepares to bring us these messages from the Word.

#### PLAN YOUR WEEK AT WORKSHOP!



#### **EVENING ACTIVITIES AT WORKSHOP**

Music Workshop is excited about our week of wonderful evening activities! On Tuesday night, we look forward to "Getting to Know You." Everyone will break into small groups of 12-14 and participate in an icebreaker activity. Following the icebreaker, you will have a chance to share with your group something you're thankful for, something you're praying about, or your testimony. Each group will then select a worship song or hymn and choose how you would like to share the song with the larger congregation once reconvened. You can present this song in any way—a formal presentation, solos, congregational singing, canon, etc. Following the small group activities, all workshoppers will return to the sanctuary and each group will present their song. Each group may also share some of their prayers, thanksgivings, and/or testimonies that were discussed within their small groups. Each group is also encouraged to share related scripture. Before departing, we'll have a reveal of Thursday night's theme!

On the second night, Wednesday, we are excited to share a beautiful cantata of chamber music, *From Silence to Song*, by Joseph M. Martin. This cantata is focused on "remembrance, reflection, and resurrection." The choir is comprised of volunteers from regional churches.

Thursday night is the return of Fun Night in *Workshop's Got Talent: Season 2*! This is the night we take a break from the demands of Workshop's rigorous schedule to relax and have some fun! Everyone will rejoin their same groups from Tuesday night and prepare their group performances (skits, songs, comedy, etc.). Individuals are also encouraged to sign up to participate! Our program will have plenty of opportunities for alternating individual and group performances. "Commercial Breaks" will also be included. Individual and group performances will be judged separately. So, start planning now for how your group, or you as an individual, can participate!
